The Red Ribbon History

Enrique (Kiki) Camarena was born on July 26, 1947 in Mexicali, Mexico. He graduated from Calexico High School in Calexico, Calif. in 1966. After graduation, he joined the U.S. Marines where he served for two years. Following his military service, Kiki joined the Calexico Police Department and later moved to the El Centro Police Department. On June 28, 1974 he became part of the Drug Enforcement Administration. Seven years later he was assigned to the resident office in Guadalajara. He worked out of this office for four and a half years and was close to exposing a major drug trafficking operation. On February 7, 1985 Kiki was kidnapped. That was the last time he was seen alive. He was 37 years of age.

Shortly after Kiki's death, U.S. Congressman Duncan Hunter and Calexico High School classmate Henry Lozano launched Camarena Clubs in Kiki's home town of Calexico, Calif. Club members wore red ribbons and pledged to lead drug free lives.

Red Ribbon Week eventually gained momentum throughout California and later the United States. The Elks have been supporters of Red Ribbon Week since the beginning. The campaign was formalized by President and Mrs. Reagan who served as honorary chairpersons. Congress officially established Red Ribbon Week in 1988. Nationwide, it is celebrated annually in the last week in October.

ELKS RED RIBBON WEEK— OCTOBER 22-31, 2025

Eugene Elks Drug Awareness will be holding Red Ribbon Week from Lodge Meeting on Wednesday, October 22nd through October 31st. Red Ribbons will be available for our members to wear during this period.

In 1986, Henry Lozano, as a member of the Board of Directors of Californians for Drug-Free Youth, Inc., created a statewide coalition comprised of the Elks, Lions, Rotary, California Narcotics Officers Association, California Drug Enforcement Administration and drug prevention parent groups who worked together to establish the first statewide Red Ribbon Week celebration in October.

In 1988, the National Federation of Parents for Drug-Free Youth championed the first national Red Ribbon Week campaign with Honorary Chairman President Ronald Reagan and First Lady Nancy Reagan. That same year, congress officially established Red Ribbon Week.

Now, at the end of every October, millions of Americans dawn red ribbons in memory of Drug Enforcement Administration Special Agent Enrique "Kiki" Camarena.

The Elks are proud to be a part of such an important tradition.

Queen of Hearts, Write Up:



Is a card game that we play at the lodge but have you ever wondered what the card components represent? Recently I read an article that said a deck of cards is like holding time in your hand. For instance, there are 52 cards in a deck which represent the 52 weeks in a year. If you count up the numerical value of a whole pack of cards, reckoning on 11 for a jack, 12 for a queen and 13 for a king, you reach 364.

Then with the addition of a joker it makes 365, the number of days in a year. The four suits can also be read as symbols: the twelve royals represent the twelve months of the year. The four suits read as symbols of society and human energy. Clubs represent both peasantry and achievement through work; Diamonds represent the merchant class; Spades, represent the warrior class and Hearts represent the clergy. Specifically, the Queen of Hearts card represents compassion, warmth, self-love, grace, counselor, healer, supportive, divine feminine, unconditional love, intuition, embodying the essence of empathy and understanding. So if at first you don't win the game, the Queen implores you to try, try, try again, because everyone can be a winner!

How to play:

- 1. Buy unlimited number of tickets at, \$1.00 per ticket/6 tickets for \$5.00.
- 2. On each ticket purchased, provide your first and last name, chosen card number (ie #1 through #54). All cards have a monetary value assigned to it. The number cards (2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10) wins you \$10.00. Face cards (J,Q,K,A) are worth \$25.00 while the Jokers are worth \$40.00. If you are lucky enough to select the Queen of Hearts you will win 50% of the pot.
- 3. Stephen McKinley will usually be at the lodge on Wednesday and Friday evenings to sell tickets.
- 4. After the sales close on Friday, all tickets sold are put into a drum and at 6:30 pm the lucky ticket is drawn.
- 5. The latest winner and card won on is displayed on the white board located in the dining room.
